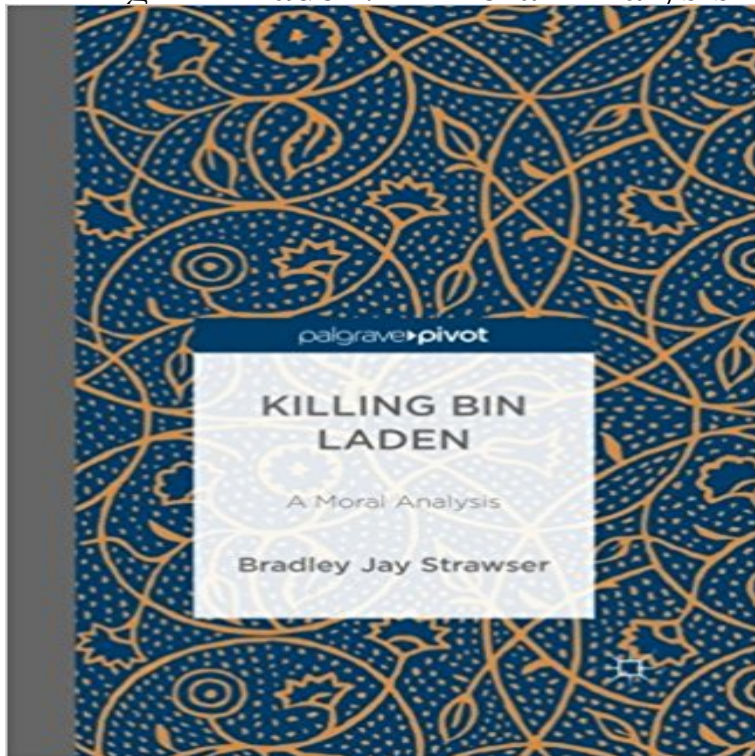


Killing Bin Laden: A Moral Analysis
