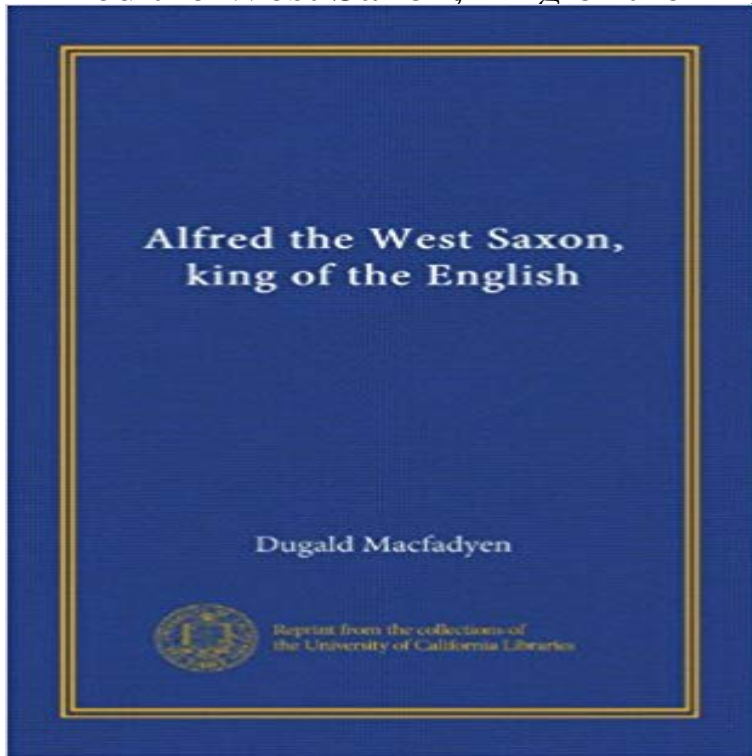


## Alfred the West Saxon, king of the English
