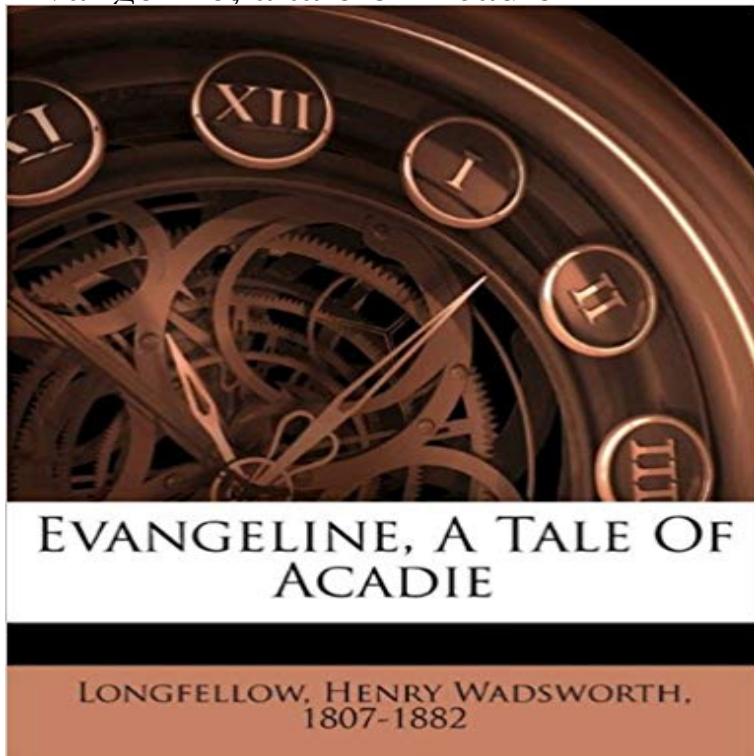


Evangeline, a tale of Acadie
