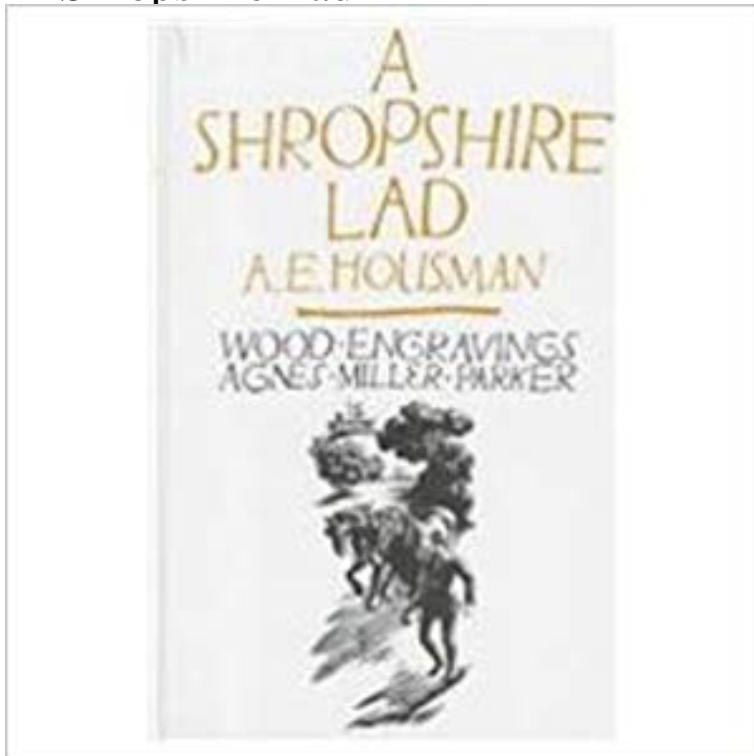


A Shropshire Lad
