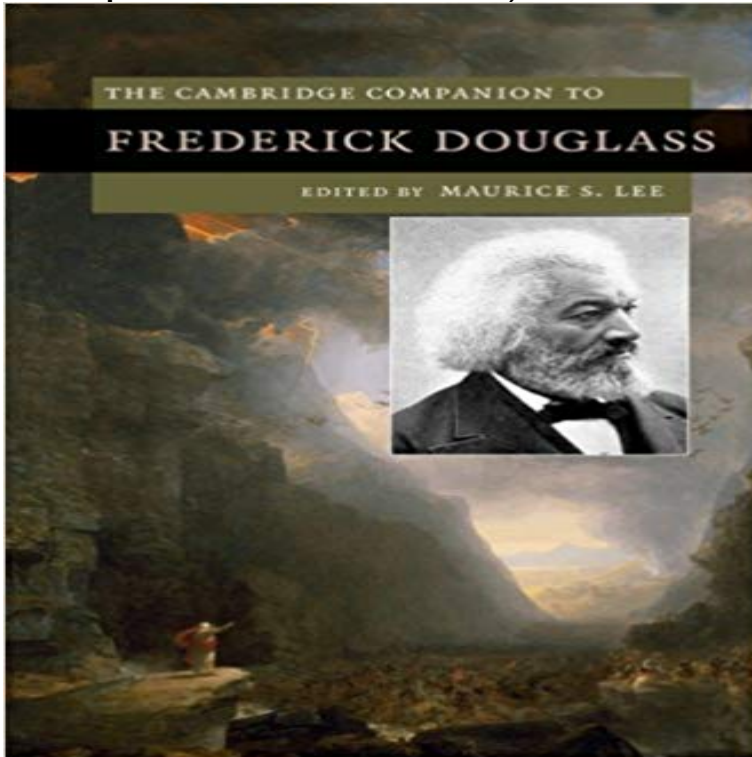


## The Cambridge Companion to Frederick Douglass (Cambridge Companions to Literature)
