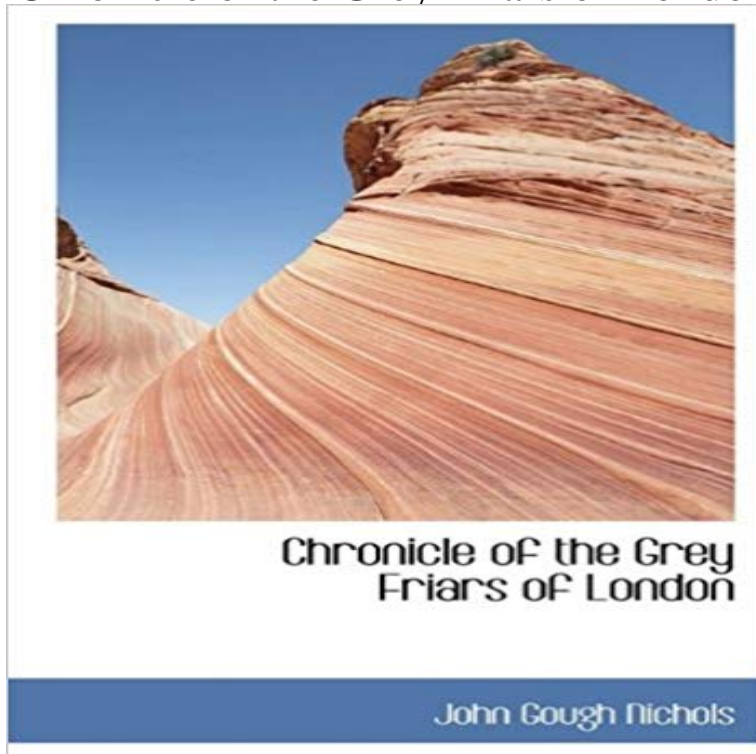


Chronicle of the Grey Friars of London
